REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING  
May 22, 2012  
APPROVED MINUTES

Chairman Kwiatkowski called the special meeting to order at 8:00 p.m.

Present: Chairman Kwiatkowski; Supervisors Davis, Malek, Rasmussen and West. Also present: Town Clerk Pepper.

Contract with Village of Mukwonago for Dispatch Services for Lake Patrol – Chairman Kwiatkowski explained that there has been much discussion regarding the requirement for dispatch by our Lake Patrol Officers. After speaking with Sergeant Dennis Nork, Chairman Kwiatkowski explained that the officers communicate with the dispatch center to determine if the boat in question is registered, to determine if the occupant of the boat in question is the actual owner, and to determine if the occupant has any open warrants. In addition, the dispatch center will print out the information that is requested by the Lake Patrol Officer for reference, in anticipation of a court challenge. Chairman Kwiatkowski explained that in order to change from the current dispatch service with the Village of Mukwonago, the Town would need to contract with Waukesha County Communication Center (WCCC). The Town currently uses WCCC for inter mobile communications on the Town patrol trucks so no additional charges would be required to add the Lake Patrol. However, in order to fulfill the requirement of Lake Patrol with WCCC, the Town would need to pay an annual charge to access the central data base for an estimated cost of \$475. The Town would also need to provide a waterproof laptop computer for the Lake Patrol for an estimated cost of \$2,500. Lastly, the Town would need to reprogram the hand held radio for an estimated cost of \$75.

A motion was made by Chairman Kwiatkowski, seconded by Supervisor Davis to contract with the Village of Mukwonago for dispatch services in the amount of \$775.00. Upon voice vote, motion carried.

Contract with the Town of Mukwonago for Entering Lake Patrol Citations – Chairman Kwiatkowski explained that, as a requirement for the Municipal Court System, the Town needs to have citations entered into the court system. To have the Town perform this process, the Town would need to purchase the required software and the annual updates. The cost is unknown at this time. Other municipalities are contracted with the Town of Mukwonago for the data entry of services.

A motion was made by Supervisor Rasmussen, seconded by Supervisor Davis to contract with the Town of Mukwonago for data entry of citations, in the amount of \$300.00. Upon voice vote,, motion carried.

Possible Purchase of a Radar Gun for the Lake Patrol – Chairman Kwiatkowski explained that the original thought of the Board was that if the Town had a radar gun of their own, the Town could save some money on mileage reimbursement. After speaking with Sergeant Nork, Chairman Kwiatkowski explained that the Lake Patrol Officer would still need to travel to the Village of Mukwonago to obtain the print outs. The cost for mileage last year was \$276.00

A motion was made by Supervisor Davis, seconded by Supervisor Malek to not purchase a radar gun for the Town of Eagle Lake Patrol. Upon voice vote, motion carried.

Public Comments – Mr. Tom Day, W350 S10115 Highview Road stated that, to save the Town money, he and John Mann put the Lake Patrol boat in the water today and will be taking the boat out of the water in the fall. Also in an effort to save money, the Town Office will be handling the monthly reports to the Department of Natural Resources (DNR).

Mr. John Mann, W349 S10110 Bittersweet Court explained that Kyle Drake with the DNR would be a contact for any help needed regarding submitting monthly reports.

There being no further business on the agenda, a motion was made by Chairman Kwiatkowski, seconded by Supervisor Rasmussen to adjourn at 8:17 P.M. Upon voice vote, motion carried.
