## ABOUT

The Town and Village of Eagle Recreation Department is committed to meeting the current and future community needs by offering quality, safe, and affordable programs to all Town and Village of Eagle residents.

The Eagle Recreation Department was formed in 2002. It is funded by the Town and Village of Eagle. Since 2002, soccer and baseball have been enjoyed by more than 200 children per season. We have added yoga, craft classes, senior events, Pickle Ball, basketball, family events, and much more! We are continually looking for ways to generate income to subsidize costs. We greatly appreciate donations to our programs from residents and businesses. Anyone interested in making a donation can contact our office at 262-949-4232.

The Town and Village of Eagle Boards govern the Recreation Department Committee. The Committee is comprised of one member from the Village Board, one member from the Town Board, one village resident, one town resident, and the Director of the Eagle Recreation Department. Their respective Boards appoint members. The Recreation Committee will be directly responsible for all Eagle Recreation decisions involving budget, expenditures of funds, policies, and programs offered by the Eagle Recreation Department. The Eagle Recreation Department Committee is also responsible for the direct supervision of the Recreation Director.

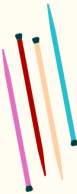

## Toenail Clinic

Toenail Clinic is available to anyone wanting or needing the service. Typically those who come to a toenail clinic are having difficulty seeing or reaching their feet, lack the grip strength needed to use a clippers, are diabetic, or take medications such as blood thinners that put them at risk of complications if they do their own nails. The toenail clinic is overseen by a Registered Nurse through Toenail Trimmers, LLC. During the visit, feet will be medically assessed, nails safely trimmed, callus care and nail debridement if needed and finished with a moisturizer. Care is recommended every 8-12 weeks. The clinic is held at the Eagle Municipal Building. Cost is \$35 for a 30 minute appointment.

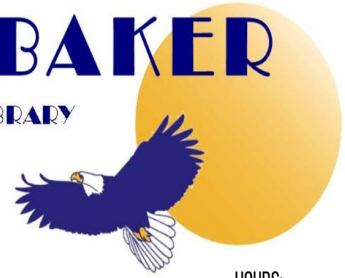

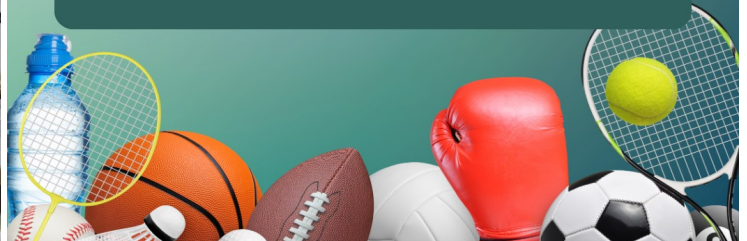

### Grandma Kate's Molasses Ginger Cookies

- 3/4 c. Crisco
- 1 c. sugar
- 1 egg, beaten
- 2 T. molasses
- 2 c. flour
- 1/2 t. salt
- 1 t. ginger
- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- 1 1/2 t. baking soda

Cream together shortening & sugar. Add egg & molasses to mixture. Combine all dry ingredients & add to wet & combine. Roll into 1-inch balls. Roll each ball in a dusting of granulated sugar. Place on a greased cookie sheet and bake at 350 degrees for 10-12 min.
